## **PM Equation**

The hourly Penman-Monteith equation for estimating reference evapotranspiration used on the CIMIS computer is a version described in the Food and Agricultural Organization's Irrigation and Drainage Paper No. 56 (Allen, R.G., L.S. Pereira, D. Raes, and M. Smith. 1998). However, bulk surface resistance is adapted from the ASCE Task Committee on Standardization of Reference Evapotranspiraton (2000). Two reference evapotranspiration equations are employed, one for a grass reference and the other for alfalfa.

**Extraterrestrial Radiation Equation** 

To calculate net longwave radiation in Eq. 10, extraterrestrial radiation,  $R_a$ , is required. The calculation of  $R_a$  is based on Duffie and Beckman (1991).
